INTRODUCTION

In 1909 Lord Baden-Powell of Gilwell, founded the Girl Guide Organisation in the United Kingdom. In 1910 the first Canadian Guide Company was registered in St. Catherine's, Ontario. In 1912 the Canadian Headquarters of the Girl Guides of Canada was opened in Toronto. In 1962 the Guides Catholiques du Canada was amalgamated with the Girl Guides of Canada.

Until 1964, all Girl Guides of Canada activities in the NWT were under the jurisdiction of either the Alberta Council which controlled guiding activities in the Western Arctic, or the Quebec Council which oversaw guiding activities in the Franklin and Keewatin Districts. In 1965 after lobbying from Local Guiding Associations within the NWT and the Yukon, the Girl Guides of Canada Organisation created the Yukon and Northwest Territories Council which assumed the responsibility for all guiding activities throughout the NWT and Yukon.

In 1965 there were 64 groups of guides\brownies in the NWT and Yukon with a combined membership of 1,200. From 1965 onwards the Yukon and Northwest Territories Council of the Girl Guides of Canada received funding on an annual basis from the NWT's administrative body, the Girl Guides of Canada, which was based in Ottawa. This funding was intended to promote guiding activities throughout the north. In 1966 the Yukon Territory was organised into one division with two districts and the NWT was divided into three divisions, the Mackenzie Division, the Franklin Division and the Keewatin Division.

By 1968 the Yukon Division was still organised into two administrative districts with a combined membership of 350. In 1968 the NWT Division had been sub-divided into 8 districts with a combined membership of 1,356. The NWT districts were Yellowknife, Great Slave Rapids, Southern Slave, Arctic Circle, Nunakput, Keewatin, Frobisher Bay and Baffin.

In 1974 the Yukon and Northwest Territories Council was divided into two distinct entities, the Yukon Council and the Northwest Territories Council. At that time the NWT Council reorganised its districts, creating four new administrative divisions: Great Slave, Eastern Arctic, Midnight Sun and Keewatin. In 1983 the Keewatin Division was renamed the Central Arctic Division. In 1985 the Nunakput Division was created. In 1986 the NWT Council reorganised its divisions again, establishing the Kivaliq, Midnight Sun, Nunakput, Great Slave Lake and Eastern Arctic Divisions. In 1988 the NWT Council reorganised its divisions

again, forming the Eastern Arctic, South Great Slave, North Great Slave, Kivaliq, Midnight Sun and Kitikmeot Divisions. In 1990 the NWT Council underwent a further period of administrative reorganisation, establishing the Eastern Arctic, North Great Slave, South Great Slave, Kitikmeot and Midnight Sun Divisions.

Each of these administrative divisions maintained its own executive body which included a District Commissioner who was automatically granted a seat, with voting rights, on the NWT Council. The council met at least twice per year, usually in Yellowknife. All Local Associations throughout the NWT were required to submit annual reports of their activities to the NWT Council's headquarters in Yellowknife.

The records in this accession were donated by the NWT Council in three separate groups. The first set of records (4 square feet) were forwarded to the NWT Archives in 1981. In 1982 1.5 square feet of records were transferred to the archives and in 1992 a further 5.5 square feet of records were donated to the archives.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

This accession consists of records created by the Yukon and Northwest Territories Council, the Northwest Territories Council, and Local Associations thorughout the NWT which were affiliated to these two councils. The records, which date from 1936 to 1990, consist of textual materials, photographs, moving images and sound recordings. As there was no discernable order to the approximately 11 square feet of materials which were donated to the NWT Archives, an attempt was made to recreate the original order of the records. The materials were firstly divided into four series: textual, photographs, moving images and sound recordings.

The textual records, which date from 1961 until 1990, were divided into 8 sub-series: Minutes of Meetings (1972-1990); Reports (1961-1989); Newsletters (1966-1990); Regional Administration Files (1966-1982); Alphabetical File System (1965-1981); NWT Council Executive Correspondence (1967-1978); NWT Council Programme Files (1967-1989); and Chronological Correspondence FIles (1966-1984).

An index to the regional administration files has been reproduced in Appendix A. A file listing of these records (items 1-1 to 9-16) has been prepared. The file list gives the box and file folder number of each item, eg. 1-1 is box 1, file folder 1. Each of the files was weeded, with duplicates being removed and returned to the NWT Council. Within each file, the original chronological order was preserved. This means that in some files the oldest correspondence is first, and in others, the most recent correspondence is uppermost in the folder.

The photographs, slides and negatives which were scattered throughout the collection in various community files were removed for preservation purposes. 471 images were selected for permanent preservation and 805 items, many of which were duplicates, were returned to the NWT Council. As the majority of the photographs were removed from community files, all photographic images have been listed alphabetically by community. Any information provided by the archivist has been included in parenthesis. A photographic subject and geographic index is available at the end of this finding aid. The subject index has been prepared according to the NWT Archives Guide to Photographic Cataloguing. The names of all individuals identified in these photographs have been included in the main index.

The collection also includes two reels of 8mm film taken in 1971 during a girl guide trip to Ottawa. There are also 11 sound recordings which document the activities of guide and brownie packs, a training session and campfire for leaders, and an Inuktitut version of the Brownie Promise, Story and Law. The sound

recordings were produced at Pangnirtung, Fort McPherson, Broughton Island, Coppermine, Cape Dorset and Yellowknife.

The records in this accession document the development of the guiding movement in the NWT. There is information on the transfer of the NWT guiding movement from the control of the Alberta and Quebec Councils, to the formation of the Yukon and Northwest Territories Council in 1964. The creation of two separate councils in 1975, the Yukon Council and the Northwest Territories Council is also documented. The files also document the relationship between the NWT Council which is based in Yellowknife, and the Local Associations in various northern communities. The records also document the relationship between the NWT Council and Girl Guides of Canada headquarters in Ottawa. There is also some information on the development of guiding programmes that were designed to reflect the unique nature of guiding in the north.

Subjects depicted in this accession include guiding programmes and activities in the north, plans to improve the delivery of guiding programmes in the north, trips to both territorial, national, and international camps, training programmes for guide leaders, and special projects undertaken by the NWT Council. The photographs document brownie and guide meetings, enrolment ceremonies, trips to national and international guiding events, guide camps in the NWT, Annual General Meetings of the NWT Council and training sessions for guide\brownie leaders. There are also a number of images of special events such as the 65th and 70th anniversary celebrations of the Girl Guides of Canada.

Communities depicted include Arctic Bay, Baker Lake, Belcher Islands, Broughton Island, Cambridge Bay, Cape Dorset, Chesterfield Inlet, Coppermine, Coral Harbour, Fort Franklin, Fort George (Quebec), Fort Good Hope, Fort McPherson, Fort Simpson, Fort Smith, Frobisher Bay, Gjoa Haven, Grise Fiord, Hay River, Igloolik, Inuvik, Norman Wells, Pangnirtung, Pine Point, Pond Inlet, Povungnituk (Quebec), Rankin Inlet, Resolute, Tuktoyaktuk and Yellowknife.

This finding aid includes a subject index for photographs, a geographic index for photographs and a main index. The main index is primarily an index to the textual records, sound recordings, and moving images. However, the names of all individuals identified in the photographs have been included in the main index. The subject and name entries in the main index have been prepared according to the NWT Archives Name Authority, and the NWT Archives Subject Authority.

A large number of artefacts including guide pins, buttons, badges, t-shirts, sashes, labels, first issue postal stamps, and 75th

anniversary souvenirs have been forwarded to the Curatorial Section of the Prince of Wales Northern Heritage Centre.

SERIES DESCRIPTIONS

This accession has been divided into four series: textual records, photographs, moving images and sound recordings. The textual records (1-1 to 9-16) which date from 1961 to 1990 document the activities of the Northwest Territories Council of the Girl Guides of Canada. Included in this series are Minutes of Annual General Meetings of both the Yukon and Northwest Territories Council and the Northwest Territories Council. Also included are Minutes of Full Council Conference Meetings, Minutes of Local Association Meetings, Annual Census Reports, Annual Division Reports, and newsletters produced by the NWT Council. There are also a large number of general correspondence files created by members of the NWT Council and the Local Associations. Subjects covered include quiding programmes and activities in the north, plans to improve the delivery of guiding programmes in the north, trips to both territorial, national and international camps, training programmes for guide leaders, and special projects undertaken by the NWT Council.

The second series consists of 471 photographs, slides and negatives (items:0001 to:0471) taken between 1936 and 1988. This series consists primarily of photographs of guiding activities in communities throughout the NWT. However, there are some images of guiding activities in Ontario, Quebec, Alberta, and Greenland. Subjects covered include brownie and guide meetings, enrolments, trips to national and international guiding events, guide camps in the NWT, Annual General Meetings of the NWT Council and training sessions for guide-brownie leaders. There are also a number of images of special events such as the 65th and 70th anniversary celebrations of the Girl Guides of Canada.

The third series consists of two 8mm film reels (items :0472 to :0473) which were taken during a trip to Ottawa made by two NWT Girl Guides in 1971.

The fourth series consists of 11 sound recordings (items:0474 to:0484) which were produced between 1963 and 1978. The recordings cover such events as a 1978 guide leadership training workshop held in Yellowknife, and brownie\guide activities at Broughton Island, Coppermine and Pangnirtung. One recording contains a 1963 translation of the Brownie Story, promise and law into Inuktitut which was made by Reverend M. Gardiner of Cape Dorset. Another recording consists of a 1972 newsletter from Hall Beach. A partial transcript of the Inuktitut recording is available (File 9-16). The recording of the training workshop at Yellowknife contains songs which were used in guide\brownie meetings.

SERIES I - TEXTUAL RECORDS - 1961-1990

This series has been broken into eight sub-series: Minutes of Meetings (1972-1990); Reports (1961-1989); Newsletters (1966-1990); Regional Administration Files (1966-1982); Alphabetical File System (1965-1981); NWT Council Executive Correspondence (1967-1978);NWT Council Files (1967-1989);Programme Chronological Correspondence Files (1966-1984). These files were all maintained by the NWT Council office in Yellowknife. Correspondence files contain copies of both incoming and outgoing correspondence. Included in this series are Minutes of Annual Meetings, Minutes of Full Council Conference Meetings, Minutes of the NWT Executive Council Meetings, Minutes of Local Association Meetings, Annual Census Reports, Annual Division Reports, and newsletters produced by the NWT Council. Subjects covered include quiding programmes and activities in the north, trips to both territorial, national and international camps, training programmes for guide leaders, and special projects undertaken by the NWT Council.

Sub-Series I - Minutes of Meetings - 1972-1990.

This sub-series consists of Minutes of Annual Meetings, Minutes of Full Council Conference Meetings and Minutes of the NWT Executive Council Meetings. The minutes include reports from Regional and District Commissioners throughout the NWT. Financial budgets, national and international camp reports, and the business operations of the Guiding store in Yellowknife are also included with the reports. These minutes have been arranged in three groupings. The first group (1-1 to 1-13) consists of the Minutes of Annual General Meetings held between 1972 and 1990. In some instances, the original agendas and minutes of meetings which have been annotated have been retained if they differ from the final version of the minutes.

The second group of minutes (1-14 to 1-27), which date from 1984 until 1990, are of the Full NWT Council Conferences which were held twice each year. Represented at these meetings are the from Yellowknife, District Commissioners Inuvik, Cambridge Bay, Tuktoyaktuk and Igaluit, the Provincial the International Commissioner and the various Commissioner, program coordinators. The minutes include reports from divisional program organisers throughout the NWT and also those on the Executive Council. Financial reports are also included in the reports package. Although there are no minutes available for the September 1988 meeting (1-24), copies of the various reports presented at that meeting are available.

The third group of minutes (1-28 to 1-40 and 2-1 to 2-17) which date from 1984 until 1990 are of the NWT Executive Council. The minutes also include reports presented by the various programme commissioners. There are no minutes available for the November 7, 1988 meeting (2-11).

Sub-Series IV - Regional Administration Files - 1966-1982

This series consists of files created by districts which operated Brownie Packs, Guide Troups or Ranger Troups. The files from each community appear to have been forwarded to the NWT Council office in Yellowknife who then created a regional administration file series. These files (3-28 to 3-31, 4-1 to 4-20, 5-1 to 5-22, and 6-1 to 6-43,) were part of this community file series. The files contain correspondence, Census Reports, Annual Reports, some Minutes of Meetings, activity plans and cash books. The annual reports detail the numnbers brownies\quides\rangers\pathfinders enrolled in each community and also list the names of guide leaders. The records document the activities of lcoal groups of guides\brownies and the relationship between the local associations and the NWT Council. The files contain requests made to the NWT Council for information about programme delivery, training for leaders, potential souces of funding, badges, and requests to purchase uniforms.

Many of the files contained photographs which have been removed and listed separately.

This series consists primarily of photographs of guiding activities in communities throughout the NWT. However there are some images of guiding activities in Ontario, Quebec, Alberta and Greenland. Subjects covered include brownie and guide meetings, enrolments, trips to national and international guiding events, Annual General Meetings of the NWT Council and training sessions for guide\brownie leaders. There are also a number of images of special events such as the 65th and 75th Anniversary Celebrations of Guiding in Canada.
